Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Edinburgh today.

Edinburgh \rightarrow 3 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Edinburgh

Included meals: welcome dinner
Welcome to Edinburgh! Transfer to your hotel
and gather for your welcome dinner this evening.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Edinburgh

Included meals: breakfast

Get to know Edinburgh in all its medieval beauty on a tour led by a local expert.

- View the elegant Georgian New Town and the Royal Mile, two UNESCO World Heritage sites
- Pass the King George statue, Bute House, and Sir Walter Scott monument
- Enter Edinburgh Castle to view the Scottish crown jewels and Stone of Scone

Spend a free afternoon in Edinburgh or add an excursion.

Day 4: Free day in Edinburgh

Included meals: breakfast
Enjoy a free day in Edinburgh or add an excursion.

Newcastle Region → 1 night

Day 5: Newcastle Region via Alnwick

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

En route to Alnwick, stop for photos in Berwick-upon-Tweed, the northernmost town in England. Then, continue along a scenic coastal route to Alnwick for a guided tour of the historic castle and gardens before making your way to the Newcastle region.

Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

York \rightarrow 2 nights

Day 6: York via Durham

Included meals: breakfast

Head to the famed college town of Durham for a sightseeing tour.

- Stroll through the old city along the banks of the River Wear
- Enter the UNESCO-recognized Durham Cathedral, known for its Romanesque style and beautiful Norman architecture

Later, drive through the charming English countryside as you continue on to York.

Day 7: Sightseeing tour of York

city with a local guide.

Included meals: breakfast
Embark on a walking tour of this historic walled

- Enter York Minster, home to largest expanse of medieval stained glass in the world
- See the York Museum Gardens, which occupy ten acres in the city center
- View the Roman wall, the oldest section of the city's historic fortifications
- Visit the ruins of St. Mary's Abbey and the King's Manor
- Enter the National Railway Museum and enjoy free time to explore the exhibits

Manchester → 1 night

Day 8: Manchester via Ramsbottom

Included meals: breakfast

Today, stop in Ramsbottom as you travel to Manchester.

- Spend some free time exploring the charming town
- Visit the Helmshore Mills Textile Museum
- Enjoy free time for lunch followed by a lecture at the local library

Then, continue on to Manchester.

Please note: The lecture is being organized by your Group Coordinator, not Go Ahead Tours.

Liverpool → 1 night

Day 9: Sightseeing tour of Liverpool

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Explore the UNESCO-recognized port city of Liverpool this morning with a local as your guide.

- View the neo-Gothic Liverpool Cathedral and the modern Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral
- Pass by the Liverpool Central Library and St George's Hall
- Head to the UNESCO-listed waterfront to see the Royal Liver Building, Cunard Building, and Port of Liverpool Building, known as the Three Graces
- Explore the Merseyside Maritime Museum to learn about Liverpool's role in the tragic voyage of the *Titanic*

Spend a free afternoon in Liverpool or add an excursion. Then, join your group for an included dinner.

+ The Beatles: History & Story Museum

Cardiff → 1 night

Day 10: Cardiff via Stratford-upon-Avon

Included meals: breakfast

Drive southeast through the countryside to Stratford-upon-Avon, the town of Shakespeare's birth. Here, you'll step inside the Shakespeare family home with a local guide.

Continue on to Cardiff, Wales and enjoy a free evening in the city or add an excursion.

+ Cardiff Choir Performance & Dinner

Bath \rightarrow 2 nights

Day 11: Sightseeing tour of Cardiff & transfer to Bath

Included meals: breakfast, dinner
Meet your local guide this morning for a
sightseeing tour of the largest city in Wales.

- View the medieval Cardiff Castle, located in the city center
- Take in views of the beautiful Cardiff Bay

Then, take a scenic drive along the Severn River to the town of Bath. Sit down for an included dinner this evening.

Day 12: Sightseeing tour of Bath

Included meals: breakfast

On a guided sightseeing tour, get to know the charming city of Bath, named a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1987.

- See the city's most famous architectural sites, including the Roman Baths, the Royal Crescent, and the Circus
- Enter Bath Abbey, to view its fan vaulting and striking stained glass window

Enjoy a free afternoon in Bath or add an excursion.

Bournemouth \rightarrow 1 night

Day 13: Transfer to Bournemouth

Included meals: breakfast
Transfer to Bournemouth, where you'll enjoy a free day.

London \rightarrow 2 nights

Day 14: London via Stonehenge & Salisbury

Included meals: breakfast

Travel to London today, stopping on the way to gaze upon the vast monoliths of the UNESCO-protected Stonehenge and visit its new visitor center before heading to the medieval city of Salisbury.

- View the soaring spire of Salisbury Cathedral, then go inside to view one of the original copies of the Magna Carta
- Marvel at Salisbury's historic architecture and wander through its charming shopping streets

Day 15: Sightseeing tour of London

Included meals: breakfast

With a local expert leading the way, take a guided tour of the regal landmarks and UNESCO World Heritage sites of the English capital.

- Pass the grand Trafalgar Square and Baroquestyle St. Paul's Cathedral, perched atop Ludgate Hill
- See Westminster Abbey, the setting for royal coronations and weddings
- View icons like Big Ben, the London Eye and the Tower of London
- Stop by Buckingham Palace, where you may catch the Changing of the Guard

Enjoy a free afternoon in London or add an excursion. Then, celebrate your trip at a farewell dinner this evening.

Day 16: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the airport in London for your flight home.

Day 3: Abbotsford House & Melrose Abbey

\$99/\$109* (5 hours, departs in the afternoon with lunch)

Travel through the Scottish Borders region to Abbotsford, where you'll enjoy an included lunch. Continue on to Abbotsford House, the 19th-century estate of Sir Walter Scott. The poet designed his home in the Romantic style to imitate the elaborate baronial estates of British aristocrats. Today it serves as a museum for the Scottish memorabilia and artifacts that Scott collected throughout his lifetime. Later, visit the ruins of Melrose Abbey, one of the most impressive of the four Borders abbeys. Please note: Some areas of the Abbey are closed off due to masonry and damage repairs. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 3 days prior to departure.

Day 4: Stirling Castle & Dunblane Cathedral

\$109/\$119* (6 hours, departs in the morning)
For generations, Stirling Castle held off British advances and served as a rallying point for rebellious Scots. It was within Stirling Castle that the infant Mary Stewart was crowned Mary, Queen of Scots. You'll learn more about the castle's extensive history as you follow along with an audio guide. Enjoy free time for lunch following the visit to the castle. Then, stop by the Robert the Bruce Statue. Next, you'll visit Dunblane Cathedral, a medieval church dating back to the 12th century before returning to Edinburgh. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 3 days prior to departure.

Day 7: Whitby

\$125/\$135* (6 hours, departs in the afternoon with dinner)

Transfer across the North York Moors on your way to the charming fishing port of Whitby. Whitby was made famous by its associations with Captain Cook (who served his apprenticeship here) and Bram Stoker's Dracula (Whitby is where the Transylvanian count first sets foot in the British Isles). You'll visit Whitby Abbey—the backdrop to Dracula's killings in the graveyard of St. Mary's Church—and the 199 steps leading to the port and its small sandy beach. Spend some free time wandering around the port before heading to a restaurant for a fish-and-chips dinner. Please note: This excursion is seasonal and runs March through November. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 3 days prior to departure.

Day 9: The Beatles: History & Story Museum

\$95/\$105* (4 hours, departs in the afternoon)
Curious about how the Fab Four came to be? This
excursion is your opportunity to discover the humble
beginnings of the band that achieved global stardom.
View special exhibitions, memorabilia, and photographs
at the immersive Beatles Story Museum. Then, join a
local expert for a guided tour of Liverpool, with special
visits to Beatles-specific landmarks such as Penny Lane
and Strawberry Fields. This excursion requires advance

reservation and must be booked at least 3 days prior to departure.

Day 10: Cardiff Choir Performance & Dinner

\$125/\$135* (3 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Immerse yourself in Welsh musical traditions and take in a show by The Cardiff Arms Park Male Choir at a local restaurant. The celebrated choir will perform a wide repertoire of pieces—including solo performances, popular songs, and hymns—during their hour-long show. Then, you'll gather with your group in a private room at the restaurant to enjoy a three-course dinner paired with your choice of beer, wine, or soft drink. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 3 days prior to departure.

Day 12: No. 1 Royal Crescent Museum & Afternoon Tea

\$135 (4 hours, departs in the afternoon)
Step into history with a visit to the No.1 Royal Crescent, a museum that has been decorated and furnished with Georgian period designs. You'll get a taste of the aristocratic life in Bath at an elegant, 18th-century style afternoon tea. Enjoy an unlimited selection of teas paired with plenty of traditional treats, including pastries, freshly baked scones, jams, and clotted cream. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 70 days prior to departure.

Day 15: Windsor Castle

\$115 (5 hours, departs in the afternoon) Led by a Blue Badge Guide, you'll travel to Windsor for a guided tour of the world's largest and longestinhabited castle. Founded by William the Conqueror in 1070, Windsor has been the British Royal Family's preferred retreat for the past 900 years. Step inside the State Apartments and St. George's Chapel, where the Knights of the Garter ceremony takes place. View the exhibit of royal treasures on display within the castle. You'll then have time to stroll through the town of Windsor and have a look at Eton College, a prestigious prep school attended by Princes William and Harry. Please note: Windsor Castle is occasionally closed when in use by the Royal Family; a visit to Henry VIII's Hampton Court will be substituted when necessary. Additionally, St. George's Chapel is closed to the public on Sundays. This excursion requires advance reservation and must be booked at least 20 days prior to departure.
